## T.W. MARTIN'S BOTTLED ALES

### What is an ale?

In this category of beer, the yeasts ferment on "top" of the fermentation vessels at temperatures of 60° - 75° F. This process takes 7-8 days or less. Ale yeasts produce chemical compounds which are generally "flowery" or "fruity". Ales come in many varieties, including India Pale Ale's (IPA's), red ales, and Hefe-Weizens.

## T.W. MARTIN'S BOTTLED LAGERS

#### What is a lager?

The word *lager* comes from the German *lagern*, which means "to store". The yeasts in lagers are "bottom" fermenting yeasts that work at temperatures of around 34°F.

They are sometimes stored at cooler temperatures to mature. Lager yeasts produce fewer by-product characters than ales which allow other tastes to come through, such as hops.
